6th Sunday Today's Gospel, perhaps more than any other passage of Our Lord's preaching, illustrates the truly revolutionary nature of the message and teaching of Jesus. The first two readings we hear at Mass today give a context for the Gospel in wisdom traditions with which Our Lord would have been familiar; St Paul announces: 'Among the mature, we do impart wisdom (but) not a wisdom of this age or of the rulers of this age'. The Lord 'is mighty in power and sees everything' (Sirach 15,18). St Paul's message to the Corinthians in the second reading shows how and why the teaching of the early Church was Trinitarian and therefore deeply Christian: 'We impart a secret and hidden wisdom of God .. the Spirit searches everything, even the depths of God'. The remarkable thing is that, in the Gospel, Jesus is able to plumb the same depths within a purely human nature which we normally regard as entirely fallible ('the rulers of this age .. are doomed to pass away'). Like the sacrifice of the Mass, the revolution proposed by Jesus is without bloodshed. 'Not an iota, not a dot, will pass from the Law until all is accomplished'

Ash Wednesday (February 18th) Times of Masses (with imposition of ashes) are advertised at the head of the page. The season of Lent interrupts Ordinary Time with its call to penitence and self-knowledge. The traditional 'ashes to ashes, dust to dust' message, which we may hear when the ashes are imposed on our foreheads, reminds us of our mortality; alternatively the words 'Repent and believe in the Gospel' recall the first coming of Jesus, heralded by St John the Baptist with the call to new life – destined for potential Christians as well as others (meaning all of us) who stand in need of a renewal of faith!

On Ash Wednesday, Mass will be celebrated in the Abbey Church at 12 noon, celebrated by Abbot Nicholas.

Sirach 15:15-20

‘He has not commanded anyone to be ungodly.’

If you desire, you will keep the commandments, and to act faithfully is a matter of choice. He has placed before you fire and water: stretch out your hand for whichever you wish. Life and death are in front of people, and whichever one chooses will be given to him. For great is the wisdom of the Lord; he is mighty in power and sees everything; his eyes are on those who fear him, and he knows a person's every deed. He has not commanded anyone to be ungodly, and he has not given anyone permission to sin.

Second reading—1 Corinthians 2:6-10

‘A wisdom God decreed before the ages for our glory.’

Brothers and Sisters: Among the mature we do impart wisdom, although it is not a wisdom of this age or of the rulers of this age, who are doomed to pass away. But we impart a secret and hidden wisdom of God, which God decreed before the ages for our glory. None of the rulers of this age understood this, for if they had, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory. But, as it is written, ‘What no eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor the heart of man imagined, what God has prepared for those who love him’ — these things God has revealed to us through the Spirit. For the Spirit searches everything, even the depths of God.

Gospel—Matthew 5:17-37

‘It was said to those of old; but I say to you.’

At that time: Jesus said to his disciples, ‘Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I have not come to abolish them but to fulfil them. For truly, I say to you, until heaven and earth pass away, not an iota, not a dot, will pass from the Law until all is accomplished. Therefore whoever relaxes one of the least of these commandments and teaches others to do the same will be called least in the kingdom of heaven, but whoever does them and teaches them will be called great in the kingdom of heaven. For I tell you, unless your righteousness exceeds that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven.

‘You have heard that it was said to those of old, “You shall not murder; and whoever murders will be liable to judgement.” But I say to you that everyone who is angry with his brother will be liable to judgement; whoever insults his brother will be liable to the council; and whoever says, “You fool!” will be liable to the hell of fire. So if you are offering your gift at the altar and there remember that your brother has something against you, leave your gift there before the altar and go. First be reconciled to your brother, and then come and offer your gift. Come to terms quickly with your accuser while you are going with him to court, lest your accuser hand you over to the judge, and the judge to the guard, and you be put in prison. Truly, I say to you, you will never get out until you have paid the last penny.

‘You have heard that it was said, “You shall not commit adultery.” But I say to you that everyone who looks at a woman with lustful intent has already committed adultery with her in his heart. If your right eye causes you to sin, tear it out and throw it away. For it is better that you lose one of your members than that your whole body be thrown into hell. And if your right hand causes you to sin, cut it off and throw it away. For it is better that you lose one of your members than that your whole body go into hell.

‘It was also said, “Whoever divorces his wife, let him give her a certificate of divorce.” But I say to you that everyone who divorces his wife, except on the ground of sexual immorality, makes her commit adultery, and whoever marries a divorced woman commits adultery.

‘Again you have heard that it was said to those of old, “You shall not swear falsely, but shall perform to the Lord what you have sworn.” But I say to you: Do not take an oath at all, either by heaven, for it is the throne of God, or by the earth, for it is his footstool, or by Jerusalem, for it is the city of the great King. And do not take an oath by your head, for you cannot make one hair white or black. Let what you say be simply “Yes” or “No”; anything more than this comes from evil.’
